


INTRODUCTION

- 2456 patients admitted to KNH IDU since start of pandemic
- Total ICU admissions: 295 (12%)
- Total deaths: 491 (19.9%)


AGE DISTRIBUTION

A general sense of loss

The suspicion and/or diagnosis of Covid -19 infection and its impact can be accompanied by many losses, which often take a considerable toll on self-esteem and one's own sense of identity.

These losses can include:

- Physical ability
- Cognitive (thinking) ability
- Home, work
- Social status and support
- Plans for the future
- Faith, hope, and a sense of god's care



REACTIONS TO COVID-19

INITIAL RESPONSE

- Shock, Denial, Blame
- Range of Emotions: confusion, despondency, anger,
- Difficulty in comprehending diagnosis
- Beginning to mobilize resources

Intervention

- Provide information on risk reduction, basic counseling
- Help person address immediate needs, including needs of family members for the duration of isolation

Aims of Spiritual Counselling

- Interior peace and serenity
- Awareness of the presence of God in ones life
- Re-integration into the community
- Positive Living
- Greater benefit from medical and psycho-social interventions ...
